**Invisible City** is a powerful documentary that follows the lives of Kendell and Mikey: two Black teenagers growing up in single-parent homes in the Regent Park Community of Toronto. There is mild coarse language and mild drug references, but these are not central aspects of the film. Instead, these scenes reflect the uncertainty and unpredictability of the lives of these teens.
