ROCKS AT WHISKEY TRENCH is a documentary by celebrated National Film Board director Alanis Obomsawin, depicting scenes from the 1990 Oka Crisis. The film focusses on the blockade erected at the Honoré Mercier Bridge and in particular, on the incident when a convoy of 70 vehicles, carrying Mohawk Women, Children & Elders across the Bridge from Kahnawake to Montreal, are violently ambushed by hundreds of Non-Indigenous Montreal residents who stand by the roadside throwing large rocks and screaming racial slurs.
